SERMON Witnesses

Seven years went by since my retirement. A lot has changed since then. One thing has not: walking with God every step of the way. See that is a strong suggestion in all our readings for today. You see when you set out in life saying: "I am going to do this and that... "most likely it will not happen. I remember putting together a whole week's schedule and being proud of my efficiency and at the end of the week nothing happened as I planned. Even these days if I dare to plan something seldom happens the way I think it should. You would think that by the tender age of 72+ I should get used to it, well it would be nice!

That is part of walking with God, that I mentioned before. The minute I feel that now I can do it on my own I am reminded that it is not so! I am sure I am not telling you anything you haven't experienced yourselves! Are we the only ones in our generation to feel this way? Not at all!

RR. There is a great call, a summon from the psalmist in our RR.

"Answer me when I call to you o my Righteous God."

You see we as the psalmist are calling on God, talking to God on a regular basis. What we ignore, do not recognize, do not hear is the answer, God's answer. Why? Because we want an answer and if it is not the one we imagine then we toss it aside, and demand the answer we want! "Let the light of your face shine upon us, O Lord!"

What are the consequences of that light shining upon us?

"I will lie down and sleep in peace for you alone, O Lord, make me dwell in safety." This is a gladness in our heart that is not attached to prosperity. Beyond the struggles over our daily affairs, our ambitions, our successes and our failures in personal and professional life, we can find mysterious grace in our relationship with God. For only you, Lord, make me dwell in safety. So you can consider all these from this point on as you walk with God and as you ask Him to answer your prayers.

II Reading. As you know between Easter and Pentecost the lectionary readings are suggesting two readings of three from the N.T. If we look at the chronological happenings of our two readings the events in Luke's Gospel are happening earlier that the ones in the Book of Acts. If we put them side by side we see a scared, doubtful crowd in Luke and a bold, hopeful one in Acts. That's why we need to compare the behaviour of the witnesses in both readings. Yes, the common theme is witness.

Funny, how people living and being in a fantasy world, or virtual world today grossly ignore and choose to question the mystery of God. Why? That's a very good question for each and every one of you to answer! What does it take for us, today's Christians, to elevate the Resurrected Christ from a ghost into our Messiah? You see no amount of head explanation or broiled fish will do that. Ordinary acts and ordinary things take on a significance far greater that themselves and convey the divine presence of God to us. They make us witnesses 2000 years later to God's mystery, of the Resurrected Christ, our Lord and Saviour!

I Reading. That is all the difference Peter and John feel when they see the beggar at the portico of Solomon.

"Silver and gold I do nota have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk!"

You see, Peter and John were considered first hand witnesses, because they walked with Jesus, yet they still had a little bit of doubt about the power of healing they received from Jesus. When they were able to heat the crippled beggar that was a sure sign that now they have to speak

up and witness to that in public. What a boldness, what a great power! At the entrance of the Temple, where many people gather at the time of prayer, Peter speaks. He can go to prison, he can be killed, yet he doesn't care for his own safety, he decides to speak. He is confrontational, accusatory in his tone. "You killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. "What about us? Can we witness to our faith, our own commitment to Christian faith as individuals and as faith community? Peter has a suggestion to the crowd: "Repent and turn to God, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord" This is the message for us today! Praise be to God. Amen.

warms. Jesus you are the first born of all creation. Help us to honour you by caring for the earth and its fragile balances in the ways we live and the priorities we set. In these ways too we would be your disciples. In the name of Christ our risen Lord
